**GETTING TO KNOW YOU**

1. What are some of your favourite hymns from our past? Why?

**WORLDVIEW**

2. The Nazirite vow was voluntary. That is, it was between the man or woman and God. They were responsible to fulfil it while not making their binding on others. Can you think of some commitments that Christians make as individuals which we need to be careful to not enforce on others? What are the dangers of doing so?

**INTO THE BIBLE**

3. Look up 1 Peter 2:1–10 and Revelation 1:5–6. What do we learn about the expectation of every true Christian?

**GOING DEEPER**

4. The Nazirite served as a “standard-bearer” (Calvin)—a reminder of what the nation of Israel was to be: a holy nation and kingdom of priests to God (Exodus 19:5–6). This is probably why so many of the requirements of a Nazareth either paralleled or exceeded those of the priesthood.

In what ways do exceptional commitment of some Christians serve to exhort us to greater service?

5. The Nazirite made a vow to forego some good things in order for a better thing, at least temporarily.

Can you identify some “good things” the Christian may be called upon to surrender for something better?

6. The Nazirite was required to offer numerous and various sacrifices at either the violation (vv. 9–12) or the fulfilment of the vow (vv. 13–20).

Why was this?

Discuss the reason for v. 21 and its lessons for Christians today.

In what ways are we tempted to self-righteousness and self-sufficiency when we commit ourselves to a particular ministry or life choice in response to God’s grace in our lives?

7. In what way did the Lord Jesus Christ fulfil the picture of a Nazirite?
